#### **BALDONS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

#### Oxford to Cambridge Expressway

As you may have seen in the media, the government have now announced their decision on the broad corridor to be pursued for the development of the Expressway (Corridor B). It is expected that the Highways England will be investigating the route options within the corridor during the next year with public consultation following on detail of preferred routes in 2019.

The broad corridor being investigated is a northerly one but has 2 options for going east or west around Oxford and although lines on the government map are not fixed, there could be implications for the Baldons at the south eastern end of the corridor which will be of concern. The council will be discussing the implications and action we need to take.

#### School Parking repairs

We hope that most parents and villagers will be pleased at the repairs to the village green edge opposite the school. This was an expensive piece of work to improve the parent drop off area which the council could not have afforded without some help from our District councillor in the form of a grant from OCC. We do hope that parents and others will drive carefully on the surface as it has to last!

#### **Bonfire**

The Parish Council have supported the plans being put in place by BEC for the bonfire in November.

#### Neighbourhood Plan - Referendum

The SODC will hold a referendum on the Baldons Neighbourhood Plan on the 4th October. By now each registered voter will have received a Poll Card and each Baldons household will have received a copy of the Plan itself together with a covering letter from the Baldons Parish Council. The question asked at the Referendum will be: "Do you want South Oxfordshire District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Marsh Baldon and Toot Baldon to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?"

It is important that you vote on the 4th October and naturally the Parish Council hope that you will vote in support of the Plan that we have worked so hard to prepare. Any queries on how to apply for a proxy or postal vote should be addressed to the SODC via their website.

## Planning applications

**New Farm House Toot Baldon P18/S2715/HH**. A revised application for a new 2 storey extension, entrance porch and renovations.

Yew Tree Cottage Toot Baldon P18/S2098/HH amended. An amended application for a garage with a lower roof line.

**13 The Croft P18/S2833/HH.** The erection of a 2 storey rear extension and external brick cladding.

The council is considering its response to the above applications

Hunters Gap, Pebble Hill P18/S2688/LB. Essential repairs to external chimney and surround. Supported by the parish council.

#### Flooding

As autumn is with us and winter is coming so we can expect rain which many will welcome to replenish gardens and land after the dry summer.

However, we had problems with ditches over flowing last winter and concerns are continuing to be expressed to the council about the problems in The Croft and Baldon Row. The council has been discussing action with land owners to resolve the problems in The Croft and ditches have been and are being cleared.

However all land owners and or tenants with a ditch on or outside their property have a riparian responsibility to ensure that the ditch is clear to allow water to run freely and without obstruction along the water course and through culverts downstream. Advice about land owner's riparian responsibility is on SODC website. Follow links from Environmental Services and flooding to water courses. If you have a ditch outside your property please help and make sure it is clear of blockages. Where road side drains are blocked we contact OCC, but it is always helpful if a kind villager near a blocked drain could make sure the top of the drain is not covered with mud and grass cuttings that are clearly capable of being brushed aside before we contact OCC.

#### Litter

Comment was made at the council at the amount of litter appearing along the road sides. The council will ask SODC to arrange a street cleaning as although we have a litter pick weekend in the spring it clearly isn't enough. A small number of villagers to try and keep road verges clear but it would be an enormous help if more of us could occasionally do the same. Please help if you can.



There can be few experiences as disheartening and utterly deflating as floating back to your car after some marvellously therapeutic shopping trip, laden with parcels and shopping bags, to find a black and yellow parking notification attached to your windscreen, like some enormous striped stinging hornet - and certainly having a stinging effect on your feelings too.

It could spoil anyone's day - but don't let it! Don't panic, don't curse and don't waste any time before getting to grips with the problem.

If you think the ticket was justified (and let's face it, some of them are), one option is to pay the fine right away, thus getting a substantial discount:

- 50% if you pay a Penalty Charge Notice or Excess Charge Notice within 14 days
- 40-60% if you pay a Parking Charge Notice within 14 days

If you think that you were parked correctly and within the rules, or there were mitigating circumstances, you can try an appeal (but don't pay a ticket issued by a parking company that isn't a member of the Accredited Trade Association - they can't force you to pay or take you to court).

If you appeal, you should explain that you didn't break any rules, and, if possible, send evidence to prove it.

Citizens Advice is frequently consulted about parking tickets. If you get one and aren't sure how to proceed, it's comforting to know that there are sympathetic people you can talk to.

#### 20th October to 6th January Light Exhibition
