#### **BALDONS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

#### **Durham Leys Developments**

Building the houses on this site is expected to start early in September. This is the largest development that has occurred in the village with the work expected to take about 12 months.

There will inevitably be some increase in traffic and inconvenience along Baldon lane and the south side track on the Green. The parish council have established a dialogue with the developers to deal with any issue and homeowners along the southern track have received a letter from Lucy's, the developers, providing contact details should problems arise.

#### Planning applications

- 1 The Croft. A Permitted Development application which was objected to by the Parish Council has been approved by SODC.
- 2 Potlands Cottages: An application for a small extension and internal changes has been approved by SODC.
- 11 The Green: SODC has approved an application for a rear extension.

#### Solar farm

SODC have issued a further short period of consultation on minor changes to the Solar Farm application which have been submitted in response to questions raised by SODC. They do not address the fundamental objections raised previously. At the time of writing the Parish Council will be considering its response required by the end of August and is likely to restate its previous objections.

#### Oxfordshire Strategic plan 2050

The Oxfordshire Growth Board has published a consultation on their website on the development framework and broad policy issues to be adopted for the next 30 years. This is to support of the population growth, commercial development, housing and transport required as part of the Oxford to Cambridge Arc promoted by government and the Oxfordshire Growth Board's ambitions for the county. Consultation is open until 8th October for anyone to comment.

The options for the numbers of houses and where they should broadly go have very serious implications for the county as a whole and the Green Belt in particular, as at their highest, they will have a devastating impact on the county and countryside. Rather than summarise all the issues here, Oxfordshire CPRE has distilled them onto their website <a href="www.cpre.oxon.org.uk">www.cpre.oxon.org.uk</a>, with advice on how to respond to the questions posed and they urge as many councils and individuals as possible to respond. The Parish Council will be discussing its response at our meeting in September.

#### **Council Tax checks**

SODC has announced its contractors are going to send letters to everyone who currently receives the 25% single occupancy discount on their Council Tax asking them to confirm who lives at the property. Around 30% of households in South Oxfordshire receive this 25% reduction in their Council Tax bill, which is not related in any way to their level of income or wealth. SODC will give people less than one month to respond – either online or by post.

#### **Playing Field**

The Trustees of the Playing Field wrote to the Council on 5th July and have said they are willing to see greater protection of the status of the Playing Field as a community asset. This is very welcome news and the Council is able to suggest a very cheap way of them doing this and alternative ways of covering the cost, which we understand would be less than £100.

However, the Trustees say it is the cost of public liability insurance that prevents them making the Playing Field available for use. The Council has offered to pay the cost but the Trustees say they won't have anything to do with the Council.

I asked the Council's insurers what they would charge a charity like the Association for the kind of policy required and they said £174 per year. There may be cheaper public liability insurance policies available but even if there aren't, is it really impossible, if the Trustees are refusing the Council's offer, for them to raise the necessary money from within the community?

The Trustees make a number of statements in their letter which the Council considers untrue. If you would like to read the full text of the Trustees' letter, you can find it on the Council's website. The Council will be publishing its reply when the Trustees have had a little time to digest it.

#### **Broadband**

The Government has announced a new programme to make full fibre broadband available to hard-to-reach rural properties. Project Gigabit targets properties that would otherwise have been left behind in broadband companies' rollout plans, prioritising those that currently have the slowest connections. The Government proposes to spend up to £114m in Oxfordshire and the neighbouring West Berkshire unitary authority where it estimates there are almost 69,000 eligible properties. The programme is due to get under way in April 2023.

#### Deep cleanse

South Oxfordshire's contractors should visit the parish in the final week of August to carry out what SODC calls a deep cleanse. The team litter picks, sweeps and removes weeds/moss on pavements next to the public highway.

In this parish there are only really two such stretches of pavement – on either side of the main road – so these should be left neat and tidy.

#### **Next Council meeting**

The Council's next meeting is on Tuesday 14th September at 7pm in the Village Hall – please note the change of date as the Council's meetings are usually on the first Tuesday of alternate months

#### PLEA FOR PEAFOWL



On Monday 19th July our new Green County Councillor Robin Bennett was presented with a letter and a petition signed by more than 200 people by a representative of the Nuneham Courtenay peafowl.

The letter asked the County Council to install signs at both ends of the village warning drivers to slow down as, as there could be peafowl in the road. This was prompted by the loss of two peafowl and a beloved terrier on the road in the preceding weeks.

Cllr. Bennett promised to take the request to Highways and we are currently awaiting a response.


